PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY1. General Overview/Missions Assigned

a. In the month of June, the battalion consisted of the following units: Battery "K", 4th Battalion, 12th Marines, Battery "L", 4th Battalion, 12th Marines, Battery "M", 4th Battalion, 12th Marines and Battery "W", 2d Battalion, 12th Marines. All units were technically controlled from a centralized FDC located at DONG HA West.

b. The primary mission of the 4th Battalion, 12th Marines remained as general support of the 3d Marine Division. Modification of this mission included Battery "K" reinforcing the 3d Battalion, 12th Marines and a "Quick Fire" channel to the 1st Battalion, 12th Marines. The battalion continued in direct support of Task Force CLEARWATER, the Combined Action Platoons, QUANG TRI, and DONG HA Combat Bases.

c. The battalion experienced its slowest month since the first of the year, firing less than 13,000 rounds. This reduction in ammunition expenditure resulted from the battalion's and regiment's efforts to keep the battalion's expenditures within the unit's ASR. It also exemplifies the unusually stable condition that existed within the battalion's area of operations.

d. The above mentioned stability is not meant to imply that there was not any activity in the Division AO. All firing positions except FSB ELLIOTT received rocket fire during the month and Battery "M" at C-1 also received a probe by a sapper unit, which was repulsed by the ARVN at the position. In all cases no damage was sustained by either personnel or equipment of the battalion.

e. On the 16th of June the battalion assumed operational control of Battery "W", 2d Battalion, 12th Marines. An inspection given the unit found it to be satisfactory with minor discrepancies. On the 23rd of June we dropped OPCON of this unit as they stood down for future displacement.

f. The battalion FDC and its personnel were used by the Pictorial Section of the Historical Branch, Headquarters Marine Corps for the filming of the new picture "Fire Mission". This picture is currently scheduled for airing on T.V. in March of 1970.

2. Operations Summary

a. During the month of June, the 4th Battalion, 12th Marines participated in the following operations: HIGHRISE (1-30 June); HERKIMER MOUNTAIN (1-30 June); MASSACHUSETTS BAY (1-19 June); IROQUOIS GROVE (19-30 June); VIRGINIA RIDGE (1-30 June); CAMRON FALLS (1-23 June); and UTAH MESA (14-30 June).

3. Results of Operations

a. Enemy casualties resulting from these operations for the month were 24 confirmed KIA's. The battalion was also credited with the destruction of 45 enemy bunkers. There was one (1), friendly casualty sustained as a result of enemy action. This resulted from a sniper round. The injury being minor, the individual was able to return to duty the next day.

5. Logistics

a. The S-4 instituted a program of complete monthly inventory of all supplies and equipment within the battalion and a turn-in of all excesses found. At the same time a revision of all maintenance schedules of engineer, ordnance and motor transport equipment was established to ensure that all items are fully prepared for any contingency assignment that the battalion might be given.

b. In this area also the battalion established a "Clothing Delivery Program", whereby, upon receipt of approved clothing requests from the firing batteries, members of the battalion supply section prepare and deliver the requested items to the forward units. Since its initiation the program has proven to be quite efficient and beneficial to all concerned.

6. Equipment

On 4 June 1969, the 12th Marines directed the transfer of one (1) PU-668 generator to the 1st Battalion, 12th Marines. This leaves the battalion with no back-up generator for its FADAC, since the second PU-668 charged to the battalion has been deadlined since August 1968 and is currently at 3d FSR.

7. Personnel and Administration

a. During the month of June the battalion continued to perform its administrative mission of personnel accounting and personnel administration in the form of centralized control. This centralized control consisted of the Battalion S-1 as the central control and each battery headquarters (administration), located in the rear in close proximity to the Battalion S-1. This centralized control continued to allow for close liaison between the Battalion S-1 and the batteries in personnel administration and the smooth, orderly flow of various administrative details.

b. This month saw the 4th Battalion, 12th Marines recommended for award of the Meritorious Unit Citation (MUC) for superior performance in providing continuous and close artillery support to Free World Armed Forces operating in the Northern I Corps Tactical Zone for the period 1 January 1969 through 30 April 1969. In addition, during this month, twenty-two members of the battalion were recommended for various personal decorations, to include: Bronze Star Medal (3), Navy Commendation Medal (6), and Navy Achievement Medal (13). In addition, four Vietnamese Crosses of Gallantry with 3 Bronze and 1 Silver.

c. June saw the personnel of the battalion receiving seven awards. The Navy Commendation Medal, 2 Navy Achievement Medals and 4 Vietnamese Crosses of Gallantry.


d. During the month of June, a total of 26 Marines applied for extensions of overseas tour of duty in WestPac.

PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY1. General Overview/Missions Assigned

a. In the month of July, the battalion consisted of the following units: Battery "K", 4th Battalion, 12th Marines, Battery "L", 4th Battalion, 12th Marines, and Battery "M", 4th Battalion, 12th Marines. All units were technically controlled from a centralized FDC located at DONG HA West.

b. The primary mission of the 4th Battalion, 12th Marines remained as general support of the 3rd Marine Division. Modifications of this mission included "Quick Fire" channels to the 1st Battalion, 12th Marines and 5th Battalion, 4th U.S. Army Artillery and Battery "K" in a general support reinforcing role to the 3d Battalion, 12th Marines. The battalion continued in direct support of Task Force CLEARWATER, the Combined Action Platoons, Reconnaissance teams, QUANG TRI, and DONG HA Combat Bases. In addition, the battalion was in direct support of six SID strings and two TPS-25 radars.

c. Battery "K" located at Fire Support Base ELLIOTT was again the workhorse of the battalion firing in excess of 6600 rounds. The majority of these fires were in support of the 3d Battalion, 12th Marines. One mission on the 28th of July for the 1st Battalion, 12th Marines resulted in 13 NVA KIA. The battery also completely reorganized its position during the month, building a total of fourteen new ammunition bunkers and four living bunkers.

d. Battery "L" was split most of the month with three howitzers located at C-2 and three located at DONG HA West. The three located at C-2 provided direct support for reconnaissance teams inserted in the southern part of the DMZ, and SID strings north of A-4. The three howitzers located at DONG HA West provided direct support for reconnaissance teams south of DONG HA, DONG HA, and QUANG TRI Combat Bases, Task Force CLEARWATER and Combined Action Platoons operating around DONG HA. On the 23rd of July the three howitzers located at C-2 moved to DONG HA West and stood down in preparation for the batteries redeployment to OKINAWA.

e. Battery "M" located at C-1 provided direct support for the two TPS-25 radars located at A-2 and A-4. It was also in direct support of Task Force CLEARWATER. The majority of the batteries fires were into the southern portion of the DMZ in support of the two radars.

2. Significant Operations Conducted

a. During the month of July, the 4th Battalion, 12th Marines participated in the following operations: UTAH MESA (1-19 July); VIRGINIA RIDGE (1-16 July); HERKIMER MOUNTAIN (1-16 July); HIGHRISE (1-31 July); IROQUOIS GROVE (1-31 July); ARLINGTON CANYON (3-31 July); WILLIAMS GLADE (12-25 July); IDAHO CANYON (16-31 July); and GEORGIA TAR (16-31 July).

3. Results of Operations

a. Enemy casualties resulting from these operations for the month were 20 confirmed KIA's. The battalion was also credited with the destruction of 35 enemy bunkers and obtained 15 secondaries.

4. Casualties Sustained

a. The battalion sustained no friendly casualties during the month of July.


5. Command Relations

a. On the 12th of July, Major T.L. EDWARDS assumed command of the 4th Battalion, 12th Marines vice LtCol. J. SCOPPA, JR. Major EDWARDS had been the Battalion Executive Officer for five months prior to assuming command of the battalion.

6. Equipment

a. The major equipment change within the battalion was the transfer of all TD 15's to the 3d Engineer Battalion. These TD 15's were replaced with TD 18's. Also during the month, the Regimental Ordnance Officer conducted an inspection of all ordnance equipment within the battalion and found it to be in excellent condition.

7. Civic Action

a. On the 4th of July, a MEDCAP team from the battalion visited the village of MON GHIA. A total of 25 Vietnamese Nationals were treated by the team. The overall reception of the battalion's MEDCAP teams has shown a marked increase in enthusiasm from the Vietnamese people over the past few months.

8. Administration

a. During the month of July the battalion continued to perform its administrative mission of personnel accounting and personnel administration in the form of centralized control. This centralized control consisted of the Battalion S-1 as the central control and each battery headquarters (administration), located in the rear in close proximity to the Battalion S-1. This centralized control continued to allow for close liaison between the Battalion S-1 and the batteries in personnel administration and the smooth, orderly flow of various administrative details.

b. This month saw members of the battalion recommended for various personal decorations, to include: Bronze Star Medal (2); Navy Commendation Medal (8); Navy Achievement Medal (25); Vietnamese Cross of Galantry with Silver (2); and Vietnamese Cross of Galantry with Bronze (2). During the month of July two (2) Navy Commendation Medals, eleven (11) Navy Achievement Medals, and one (1) Purple Heart Medal were presented by the Battalion Commander to members of the battalion.

c. During the month of July, a total of five (5) Marines applied for an extension of overseas tour of duty in the Republic of Vietnam.

9. Communications

a. The communication section completed a complete LTI of Battery "L's" equipment in preparation for the batteries redeployment to OKINAWA. All equipment was found to be in an excellent state of repair.
